Hello ,

My name is Michael Kamerick. I am here today on behalf of the Sierra Club. The Sierra Club is *very* concerned about the proposed Resolution. We believe this resolution is contradictory to MCE's mission as a community choice aggregator and we are concerned that this resolution would create less transparency between the staff and Board, as well as MCE customers.

The Sierra Club urges the Board to embrace public Engagement and transparency. Specifically, we'd like to see MCE establish a Board and Staff culture which embraces input, questions, and concerns from the public while striving to provide robust transparency into the agency's procurement policies and progress.

Additionally we are very concerned about the lack of transparency surrounding MCE's resource contracts, especially contracts with fossil fuel resources.

We urge MCE to fulfill MCE's Clean RA Goal: Develop and enact a robust, actionable plan to achieve MCE's stated 50% by 2030 clean RA goal through long-term investments in clean energy and storage capacity.

I urge the Board to reject Resolution 2026-02, to re-establish the transparent, public process required under R.2020-04, and to move swiftly to investigate and address the serious issues which have been raised with MCE's current procurement practices. Thank you for your time.
