Dear MCE Directors,

The Marin Electrification Council is a community-based organization in Marin County with eighty members representing most of Marin's twelve jurisdictions. Our mission is to promote local climate policies and action that accelerate the transition of vehicles and buildings away from fossil fuels, in a fair and just marketplace, to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve air quality and enhance public safety. Over the years we have worked with MCE staff, with a particular focus on MCE's EV and home electrification rebate programs.

Over the past several months, we have developed serious concerns with MCE's governance, including transparency, accountability and Board oversight as described in the deeply researched and well documented report by the Marin Civil Grand Jury. **We strongly support the findings and recommendations in the Civil Grand Jury report and urge the Board to accept these. We also urge that the CEO search committee include Board members with a broad diversity of viewpoints, especially at least one or two of the Board members who have been calling for reform.**
